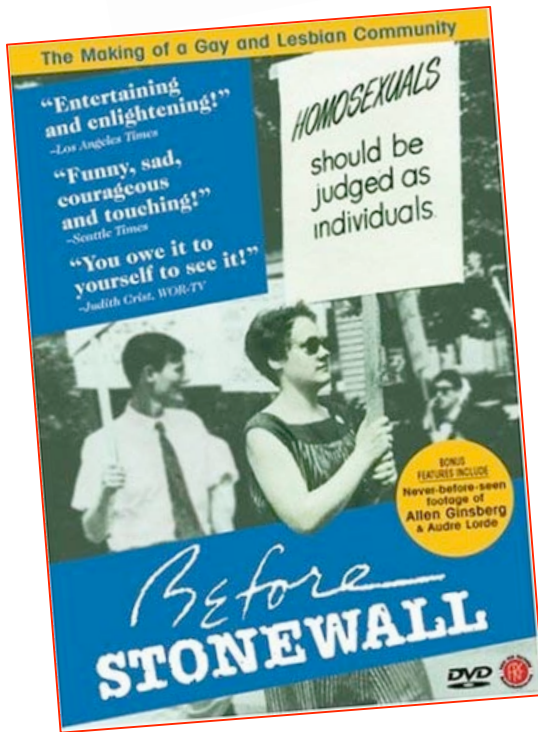




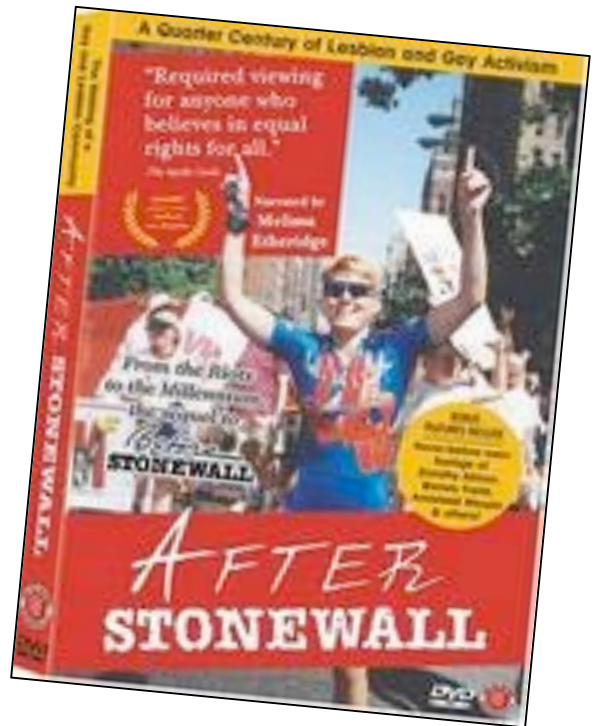
WHAT MOVIE DO YOU WANT TO SEE TONIGHT?



Before Stonewall is a documentary about the evolution of gay culture in the U.S. from the early 1920s to the Stonewall riot of 1969. Embellished with archival footage and photography from five decades, the film most prominently features the gay underground of the '20s and '30s, the rise of gay service in the military and workforce during WWII, the persecution of gays as "subversives" and "sexual perverts" in the state department by Senator McCarthy, the growth of the first grassroots political organizations for gay men and lesbians in the '50s, and of course, the civil rights movement leading up to Stonewall.



The sequel **After Stonewall** is equally informative. The tone continues to be on the serious side and traces the uglier developments as the gay backlash develops in the late



1970s. It also shows the rise of the Religious Right. At about 90 minutes, this program was first made for TV, but received theatrical screenings.
