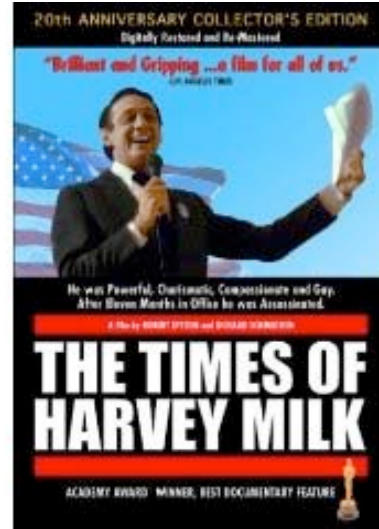




“The Times of Harvey Milk” Thursday May 21, 2009 at The Loft *

Bone chilling with its insights and memories, the Academy Award-winning, *Times of Harvey Milk* tells the story of the legendary San Francisco supervisor, one of the first openly gay elected officials and his tragic assassination.

*This extraordinary, compelling portrait of the slain San Francisco supervisor won a much-deserved **Academy Award for Best Documentary**. Few films pack such a powerful wallop as it documents the true-life story of Harvey Milk, a Castro Street camera shop owner who became the country's first openly gay elected official. His rise to power and success as a leader of minorities abruptly ended in 1978 when he and Mayor George Moscone were assassinated by Dan White, an anti-gay former colleague of Milk's on the Board of Supervisors and a former police officer. The film follows the searing episode of injustice as White is given a light sentence -- using the infamous "Twinkie defense" -- that sent thousands of outraged citizens into the streets of San Francisco.*
